

The Cowdens of Western Pennsylvania

The Cowdens of Western Pennsylvania, as related in various resources, are believed to be of Scotch-Irish descent, but one source states, "The name Cowden is of unknown origin and date" (Welch 9). As with much of history, there seems to be some conflicting accounts of the Cowdens in various books about the clan. However, where alternative historical accounts have been discovered, an effort has been made to note them in the family tree below that begins with John Cowden:

John Cowden I

Born 1735, Paxtang, Pennsylvania. Died 1776 while *en route* to present-day Western Pennsylvania. Desiring to settle "among the fertile waters that flowed toward the Ohio," Cowden was "said to be buried in Cumberland, which is doubtful" (Welch 25). Married Mary Reynolds about 1750.

Following the death of John Cowden, "Mary Reynolds Cowden removed to Washington County, Pa., with her family, by the natural route through the Cumberland Gap, via Casselmans, Confluence, Uniontown, Brownsville, (formerly called Parkinson's Ferry and Old Redstone Fort) to Canonsburg.....In 1787, Mrs. Cowden received a patent of land from the young Commonwealth...." (Welch 25). Becoming blind with age, Mrs. Cowden "could go from the cabin across the hill to a spring where the milk and butter were kept, a distance of 200 yards, and could perform the household and kitchen duties as spry as when she was young" (Welch 26). When her grandson, Isaac Patterson Cowden (her son, John's boy, "so named after his uncle who had gone to Ohio"), was around ten years of age, he "would go to the little run at the foot of the hill in front of the cabin where several generations of children have dabbled and fished with bent pins. He would watch for snakes while his grandmother was washing out wool that was to be spun into yarn" (Welch 26). Mrs. Cowden lived to 84, dying without a will. "The joint title of the nine heirs to the farm of Hornhead, in Washington county was bought by her son, John, for \$1,000.00. She lies at rest in the old graveyard at Mahoning, Pa., on the Ohio line. She died at the home of her youngest son, Dr. Isaac Patterson Cowden.

John and Mary Cowden were parents of the following **offspring**, including "three children who perhaps did not live to maturity" (Welch 22):

Joseph Cowden

Born October 1, 1765. Married Mary May (August 12, 1771 - February 3, 1857). At Canonsburg, went with his brothers, William and Reynolds, to Mahoning County, Ohio between 1795 and 1800, settling near Lowellville, according to Welch. Joseph Cowden died September 19, 1849, aged 86, and is buried at Poland Center, Mahoning County, Ohio. The **children** of Joseph and Mary May Cowden were:

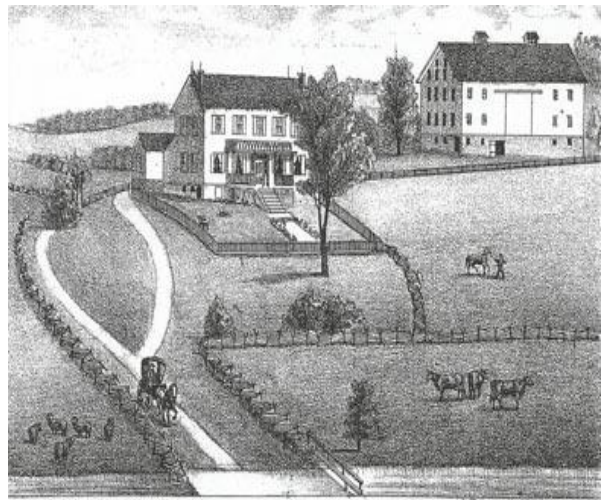

William Cowden

Born 1774. Like his brothers, Joseph and Reynolds, William Cowden settled in Ohio. According to Welch, he "was tall and had black eyes" (Welch 30). Died at Poland Center, Ohio in 1854. Wife's name unknown. **Offspring** included:

John Cowden II

Born in 1758 at Paxtang, Pennsylvania. Died June 15, 1827 at Hornhead farm in Washington County, Pennsylvania. "He came to this locality with his widowed mother and the unmarried members of the family about 1780. Probably the brothers that moved to Ohio came here first and perhaps the sisters, Mrs. McNary, Mrs. Scroggs and Mrs. Hanna came at or about the same time. Mrs. Cowden, with true motherly instinct, appears to have striven to keep her children about her even after they had grown up" (Welch 68). John Cowden II, "about the time [his mother] secured the actual title to the farm which she had been occupying" (Welch 68), was married to Annie Sloan of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. Born in 1765, she was the only child of Lieutenant David Sloan, who was killed in the battle of Long Island. John and Annie had five **children**:

John Cowden III

Born February 25, 1789. Married Mary Kelso. Died February 1, 1855. "My grandfather was twice bitten by a copperhead snake. The first time upon the heel while plowing. The second time upon the hand while binding a sheaf in the harvest field. The first time the remedy was whiskey and fresh milk. The whiskey was obtained from a neighbor. Miss Harriet Denny, of Canonsburg, whose father was a tenant upon the Cowden farm, said to me when she was quite aged, that she could recall the day distinctly and that it was the only time Mr. Cowden was known to tolerate liquor upon the place. His position in the church and the manner of his father's death had established him in positive temperance views. He was an advocate of total abstinence greatly in advance of his time. Upon the second occasion the cure that was made use of was to bind a hot roasted onion upon the wounded hand. It may have been more painful than the other remedy but its moral influence was better" (Welch 97). John Cowden III fathered the following **children**:

Sidenote: "On June 16, 1898 a reunion of the Cowdens was held on the old Homestead farm in Mt. Pleasant township, Washington Co., Pa., that was designated by the name of Hornhead when it was patented to the first owner, the widow Mary Reynolds Cowden, in 1787. About two hundred relatives and friends were at the gathering, which was favored with an ideal day. Addresses were delivered, a few scraps of history were read, and a sumptuous picnic dinner was served by the kindred who lived near at hand. A picture of the assemblage was taken after the feast, also a panoramic view of the homestead from the opposite hill. Altogether the occasion was most delightful. In the six years that have elapsed from that time to this many sad changes have occurred. The day will live in the memory of all who were present as one of unusual pleasure and interest" (Welch 103, 105).

Mary Cowden Welch

Born March 11, 1838. Educated at Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, "being a graduate of Olome Institute which was a famous seat of learning for the culture of young ladies in the old days before the war" (Welch 106). Married Rev. Robert Caldwell Welch on November 10, 1864. After the Civil War, in which Rev. Welch served, the family settled in Taylorstown, Pennsylvania and Rev. Welch pastored the United Presbyterian church in nearby North Buffalo, Pennsylvania. Following the death of her husband, Mrs. Welch "removed to Canonsburg and for a time dwelt with her sister, Mrs. Miller, but without delay purchased a five-roomed brick house at the head of Greenside Avenue, on Pitt Street" (Welch 108). Mrs. Welch died October 26, 1899 at St. John's General Hospital, Allegheny, Pennsylvania, of pneumonia. The Welch **children** included:

Married James Scroggs around 1772. Welch wrote: "It is incorrectly stated in Crumrine's History of Washington County that she married Reynolds Scroggs. Reynolds being the name of her mother before marriage, and it being affirmed by some of the friends in Washington County that a Reynolds Scroggs did marry a Cowden, made a very patience-trying puzzle. This mistake and a bewildering statement made in connection with much

valuable information furnished by Rev. Joseph A. Scroggs, of Canonsburg, Pa., to the effect that his grandmother's name was certainly JANE Cowden and that she was buried at Cadiz, Ohio, and that her grandson, Rev. William H. Vincent, D, D., had in recent years erected a stone to mark her last resting place, was confusing. Along with all this, mixing things more hopelessly, came word from the Mayor of Cadiz supplying the following item from the Recorder's Office: 'Mrs. Sarah Scroggs, widow, born in Penna., died, in Cadiz, O., March 7th, 1875, aged 80 years.'" (Welch 38). James Scroggs and Margaret Cowden Scroggs, his second wife, farmed near Miller's Run, producing the following children:

Ebenezer Scroggs

Married Sarah Monteith and had four children. (She is the actual Sarah Scroggs referenced by the Mayor of Cadiz, Ohio.) Well-educated and wealthy due to his wife's inheritance from a rich Scottish bachelor uncle. Ebenezer and Sarah had four children, whose names are not recorded by Welch, and who died early in life. Upon the death of his wife, Ebenezer and his children relied on the financial support of his siblings.

John Scroggs

Married Jane Paxton. Scroggs "reached an advanced age, living with his brother, Rev. Joseph Scroggs of Ligonier" (Welch 48). Scroggs has been described as "genial and pleasant," but it is said that "his visionary tendencies and his bitter enmity to secret orders, especially to Masonry, which was a prominent characteristic of the Associated Church of that day, rendered him somewhat peculiar" (Welch 48). Scroggs published the Washington, PA-based *Anti-Mason Investigator*, and is said to have "invented a number of curious and complicated machines but was not successful in having them brought into general use" (Welch 48). A Canonsburg textile mill, financed in part by his brothers and sisters, was destroyed by fire. The burning of the mill was all the more catastrophic because it was his primary source of income. Born October 4, 1799 at North Buffalo, Pa. Graduated at Jefferson College at Canonsburg, Pa. in 1818. Studied theology with Dr. Anderson at Service, Pa. Ordained to the ministry in 1821, installed over Cadiz, Ohio, Piney Fork and Willis Creek. Pastor from 1851 to 1862 at Washington, Pa. Was Stated Clerk of the Associate Synod from 1842 to 1858 when that denomination became part of the United Presbyterian Church. Died at Washington, Pa. on February 9, 1864 of "paralysis." Dr. Isaac Patterson Cowden

On the night of John Cowden I's death (see above), it has been said that the family's horses were presumably "stolen by Indians or Tories." One source states, "A few weeks thereafter a child was born to the widow, Mary Reynolds Cowden, being her twelfth child. She called him Isaac Patterson Cowden, after a neighbour who had been kind and helpful to them in their trouble and bereavement. These facts come through letters written by descendants of that child" (Welch 24). Furthermore, Dr. Cowden was said to have joined his three brothers in Ohio after their settlement where he "became a doctor and surgeon of wide reputation and an elder in the Associate Reformed church" (Welch 32). He married four times: Mary McWilliams (January 15, 1805), who died on December 25, 1808; Jean McBride (November 28, 1809), who died November 9, 1816; Mary Watson (November 1817), who died on March 3, 1828; Ann Law (January 13, 1830), who died on October 17, 1865. Suffering from cancer of the face, Dr. Cowden died on October 22, 1855. His **offspring** included:
